Seeing Jesus in the Storms of Life

John 6:15-21



1. Three of the Gospels record the story of Jesus walking on water, and each has details the other Gospel accounts did not include. Read John 6:15-21, Matthew 14:22-33, and Mark 6:45-52 and write down every detail to this miracle that is unique to each of the gospel accounts.
2. The most common command in all of Scripture is some version of “do not be afraid.” One author counted them up and said there were 365 occurrences, one for each day of the year! Look up at least 10 of those occurrences and write down why God has to say, “do not be afraid.” What personal application can you take from the Sermon and the Scripture passage that will help you handle the storms of life when they come?
3. Pastor mentioned that God often sends the storm and surely always allows the storms that come into our lives. What purposes does God have for either sending the storms or allowing the storms of your life? Pastor mentioned Jonah and the current situation with the disciples as two different possible purposes for allowing storms to invade people’s lives; Psalm 107:24-32 is another reason. Meditate and write down reasons God allows/brings storms into our lives:
