Lord, Your Will Be Done

Matthew 26:36-46



1. Read Matthew 6:9-13 three times in one setting, each time slower than the previous time, and reflect on the six petitions the Lord taught us to bring before the Father.
2. This week Pastor highlighted Jesus' words "Your will be done" (Matthew 6) and mentioned 4 aspects to God's will: _____, _____, _____, and _____. Look up the following Scriptures and put them under the respective aspect of God's will to which they belong:
 - Romans 12:1-2
 - Deuteronomy 29:29
 - I Timothy 2:3-4
 - Colossians 4:12
 - I Thessalonians 4:3; 5:13-18
 - Proverbs 3:5-6
 - Psalm 119:105
3. Read Matthew 26:36-46 and write down any insights you glean from meditating upon Christ's interaction with His Father as it pertains to God's will being done. Try to make five truth statements based on this passage of Scripture:
4. Pray the first half of the Lord's prayer ("Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done.") using the three petitions as pegs by which you hang your personal prayers. Remember: these first three petitions prioritize God's glory. As a help for your time of prayer, we have said the first three petitions could be translated:
 - "Hallowed be Your name" = Set apart Your name through me
 - "Your kingdom come" = Set up Your rule in me
 - "Your will be done" = Set down Your will in me
