- 1. Read meditatively Luke 1:26-38 and 2:1-20 and write down several aspects of the birth of Christ that stand out to you this Christmas season. What questions come to your mind?
- 2. Pastor shared that the virgin birth is without dispute in the Word of God. Look up the following Scriptures and write down what significance they have to the virgin birth:
 - Genesis 3:15
 - Isaiah 7:14; 9:6
 - Gabriel in Luke 1:26-33
 - Matthew 1:18
 - Joseph in Matthew 1:24-25
 - Mary in Luke 1:34-38
- 3. Pastor shared a number of implications that emerge for Lakesiders from the miracle of the virgin birth.
 - **Proves** the Word of God is trustworthy. How does the virgin birth prove the Word of God is trustworthy, and why is that of value to you?
 - **Provides** a sinless Savior. How does the virgin birth provide a sinless Savior, and why is that so important for your sake?
 - **Presents** God as absolutely sovereign and the initiator of salvation. How does it prove God is sovereign and the initiator of salvation?
 - **Provokes** or prompts a response. How does the virgin birth provoke a response from you?
