- Read Hebrews 11:13-16. How did our faithful ancestors view their earthly life? (See vs. 13.) What did they set their minds on? (See vs. 16.) What are some specific ways that we can follow their example in our own lives?
- In 1 Cor. 15:30-32, Paul says that he has suffered because of his faith in Jesus. Has your faith ever cost you something or drawn criticism? If you fit into this world as easily as a non-Christian does, do you need to make any changes to reflect that you have an ETERNAL perspective?
- If you knew you were going to die in 60 days, what would you do with your remaining time and your possessions? Should you be doing any of those things NOW?
- Read about Stephen's death in Acts 7:54-60. What did Stephen see in his final moments? What hope does this give you for how Christians can face the end of this life? How did Stephen's dying vision affect his attitude toward those attacking him?
